SEARCH ROOM REGULATIONS

The following rules are to be observed to safeguard the documents at the National Archives

- 1. Researchers must complete an Application for Research form each day he or she uses the Search Room.
- 2. Briefcase and bags must be placed in the lockers provided. Researchers must only enter the Search Room with pencils and paper.
- 3. No smoking, eating or drinking is allowed in the National Archives Search Room.
- 4. Due care must be taken in handling fragile documents.
- 5. The National Archives reserves the right to withhold any document where continued use would cause serious damage to the item.
- 6. Care must be taken to avoid undue pressure on documents. No leaning on documents or placing of items on documents are allowed.
- 7. Records are not to be marked, torn, defaced, rearranged or in any way damaged. Any damage to documents must be drawn to the attention of the National Archives staff.
- 8. The Researcher must leave all documents on the desk after use upon leaving the Search Room.
- 9. The Researcher must assume full responsibility for infringement of laws related to intellectual and other property rights when using material obtained from the National Archives.

I declare that I have read the rules governing the use of the National Archives Search Room facilities and the documents therein, and I agree to abide by them. I also agree that I will acknowledge in any publications, dissertations, etc., the source of documents used in the National Archives.
